

Glocal Conflict


A conflict that combines globality and locality in social, political, and economic aspects, which causes domestic problems affected by global phenomena and issues



- ➤ Who is a Participant?
 - : A full-time graduate student supervised by a BK21 Participating Professor (Less than 2 years of MA and 4 years of Ph.D.)
- ➤ Who is a Fellow?

: A participant receiving a monthly scholarship

2. Benefits

Benefits for Participants

- ✓ Domestic and overseas academic conference participation fees and expenses
- ✓ Short-term field trip expenses (within 2 weeks)
- ✓ Support for participation in overseas education programs (e.g. Dual Degree Program at SOAS)
- ✓ Research support
 - Publication fee of academic articles in refereed-journals
 - Incentives for publication of academic articles in refereed-journals
 - Colloquiums and special lectures by experts
- ✓ Textbooks within a range of price
 - Only for Participants who are not Fellows
 - E-Book recommended
 - First come, First served until the budget runs out
- ✓ BK21 Programs by KU (e.g. Thesis Clinic, KUGS Career Development Extracurricular Program)

- ✓ All benefits for Participants (*Except support for textbooks)
- ✓ Fellowship (MA 6 months, Ph.D. 1 year)
 - MA: ₩ 1,000,000/mon
 - Ph.D. student: ₩ 1,600,000/mon
 - Ph.D. candidate: ₩ 1,300,000/mon

- Responsibilities of Participants and Fellows
 - ✓ Taking 'Introduction to Graduate Studies (GRA511-00)'
 (Mandatory only for students admitted after Spring 2021)
 - ✓ Active participation in seminars, special lectures, and workshops by BK21
 - ✓ Mandatory participation in the BK21 Program Satisfaction Survey conducted at the end of the semester
