- Field of social and industrial problem

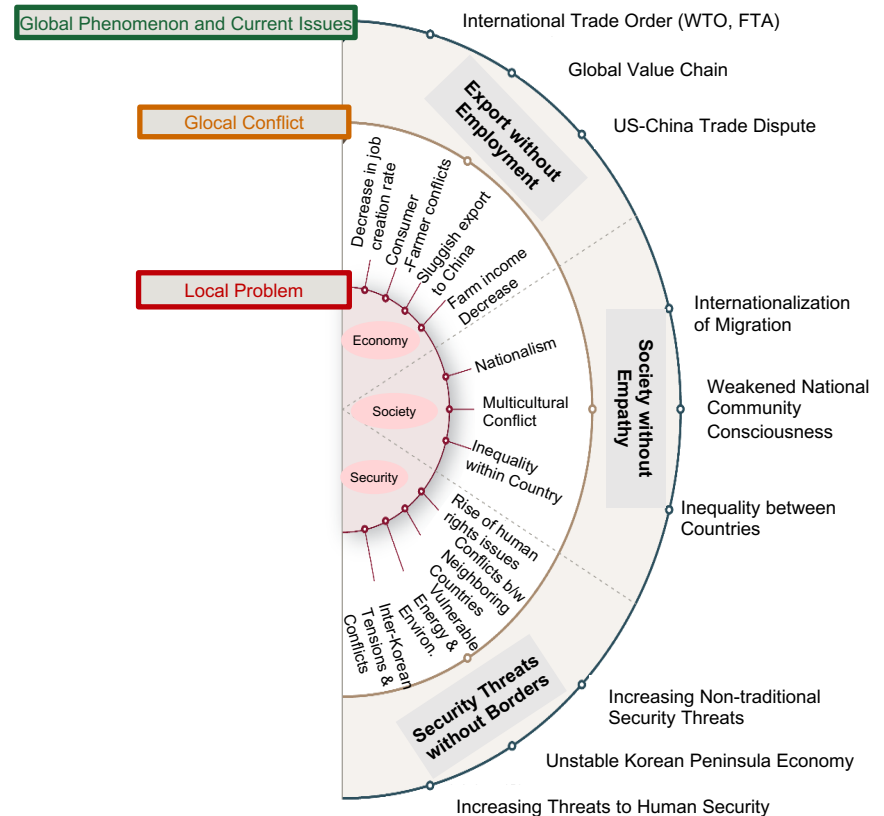

# 1. Glocal Conflict Management

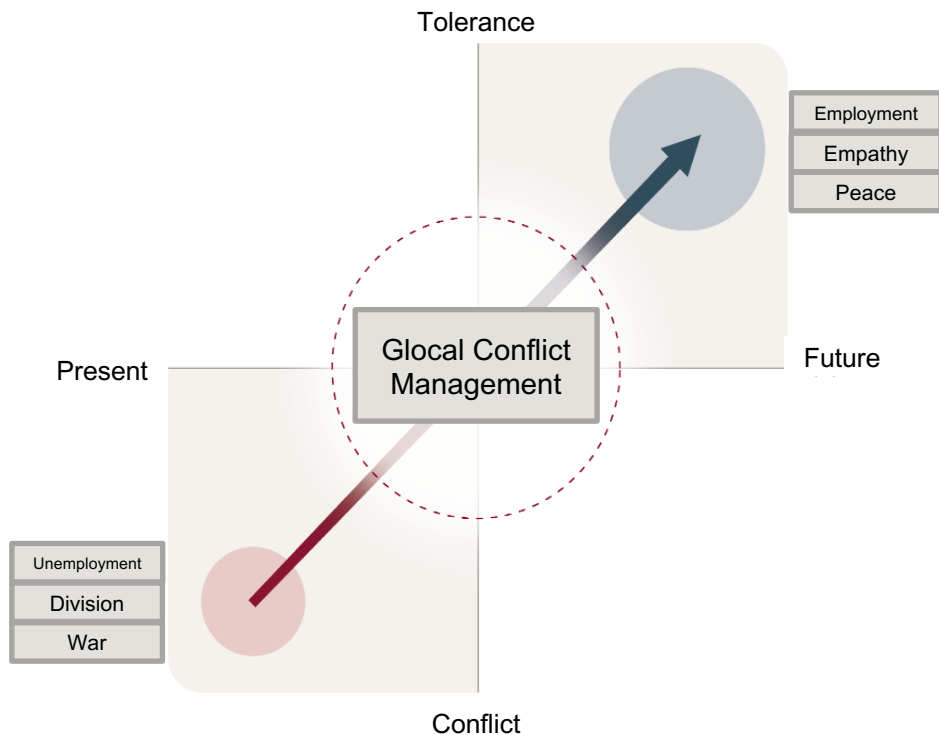
## ➤ What is glocal conflict management?

Glocal conflict is a conflict that combines globality and locality in social, political, and economic aspects. It refers to the factors that cause domestic problems affected by global phenomena and current issues.

Glocal Conflict Management is the process of being able to identify and handle glocal conflict through research.

# **Academic Support Program**

# 1. Participants & Fellows & Virtual Writing Clinic Editors



## ➤ Who is the participant?

: A full-time graduate student led by a professor participating in the BK21 project (less than two years master's degree and four doctorate years students) who is able to devote more than 40 hours per week to related research and classes

## ➤ Who is the fellow?

: A participant who receives a scholarship

## ➤ Who is the editor?

: A participant who works for the Virtual Writing Clinic and receives a payroll

## 2. Virtual Writing Clinic (VWC)

---

### ➤ What is the Virtual Writing Clinic?

: The VWC provides English editing services for students of the GSIS BK21 program at any stage of the writing process. It is a free resource to all participants and fellows for any kind of writing project: term papers, CV, memorandums, essays, presentations, applications, and so on.

The VWS plans to provide English proofreading services by hiring students whose native language is English, one by one in the three fields of development, commerce, and peace and security.

# 3. Benefits of Program

---

## ➤ Benefits for participants

- ✓ Support for domestic and overseas academic conference participation fees and expenses
- ✓ Support short-term (within two weeks) field trip expenses
- ✓ Support for participation in overseas education program
- ✓ Support research activities
  - Support publication fee of academic articles in a refereed-journal
  - Provide incentives for publication of academic articles in a refereed-journal
  - Hold colloquiums and special lectures by experts
- ✓ More opportunities to apply to competition for the participants (e.g. Social Engagement Organization)
- ✓ Thesis Clinic service
- ✓ Provide a textbook (E-book) or statistical analysis software (e.g. STATA) within a range of price
- ✓ English writing editing service through the VWC

# 3. Benefits of Program

---

## ➤ Benefits for fellows and virtual writing clinic editors

- ✓ All benefits for participants **except providing a textbook or statistical software**
- ✓ Fellowship (6 months)
  - Master's student: ₩ 700,000/mon (minimum)
- ✓ Fellowship (a year)
  - Ph.D. student: ₩ 1,300,000/mon (minimum)
    - But ₩ 1,000,000/mon (minimum) for a Ph.D student who completed coursework
- ✓ Virtual Writing Editor (6 months)
  - ₩ 700,000/mon (minimum)

# 4. Responsibilities of Participants and Fellows

---

## ➤ Responsibilities of both participants and fellows

: We anticipate both participants and fellows to participate actively in seminars, special lectures, and workshops hosted by KU GSIS BK21 Program of Glocal Studies.

## ➤ Additional responsibilities for the fellows

- ✓ Acquisition of “Glocal Conflict Management Expert” certificate (mandatory for Masters and Ph.Ds)  
(※ Applicable to students entering the 1<sup>st</sup> semester of 2021)
  - Take courses certified by “Glocal Conflict Management Expert”
    - At least 5 courses for a master’s student and 10 courses for a Ph.D. student  
(including 2 or more subjects from “General Conflict Management Policy Analysis”)
  - Internship in a local government (Due to the Covid-19, internship can be substituted by attending workshops and seminars held by the GSIS BK21 program of glocal studies)
- ✓ Master’s program: requires to select thesis track
- ✓ Ph.D. program: requires to publish an article in a refereed journal (KCI, SSCI, or Scopus)  
as the 1<sup>st</sup> author or the corresponding author before the defense
